<p>Goal 1: Health of Children & Families</p> <p>1.1 Babies are born at a healthy weight (over 5 lb, 8 oz).</p> <p>1.2 Children and youth receive regular, preventive health care.</p> <p>1.3 Obesity rates for children and youth are decreasing.</p> <p>1.4 The percentage of youth pursuing risky behaviors is decreasing (alcohol, drug, tobacco abuse, sexual and violent behaviors, etc).</p>	<p>Goal 2: Safety of Children & Families</p> <p>2.1 Bullying in schools is decreasing.</p> <p>2.2 Children and youth report an increasing sense of neighborhood safety.</p> <p>2.3 The incidence of domestic/child abuse & neglect is decreasing.</p> <p>2.4 The number of juveniles arrested for felonies is decreasing.</p>
<p>Goal 3: Education of Children & Families</p> <p>3.1 Children enter kindergarten ready to learn.</p> <p>3.2 Elementary grade students are prepared to succeed in later grades.</p> <p>3.3 High-school graduation rates for all income and ethnic groups are increasing.</p> <p>3.4 Young adults make a successful transition from high-school to work life or higher education.</p>	<p>Goal 4: Stability of Children & Families</p> <p>4.1 Children and youth report positive values and Identity (integrity, honesty, self-esteem, high sense of purpose, etc).</p> <p>4.2 Lower-income families have money saved for emergencies.</p> <p>4.3 Lower-income families successfully transition to middle and upper income.</p> <p>4.4 Families are positively connected through mutual support networks (community centers, churches, neighborhoods, youth groups, etc).</p>
